HOW TO PLAY WIN-10:

This game is played with a bet slip similar to the type used for Lotto. The cost is \$1 per game and you can play as many as 5 games per bet slip. You can play for one day or seven days at a time.

You can choose 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 or 10 numbers between 1 and 80. Each day the Lottery will randomly select 20 winning numbers from a field of 80. The chart below shows you the various prize levels and the prizes you can win. You determine the prize and the odds you want to go for by selections you make. See your Lotto agent for a game brochure and complete details.

WIN-10 PRIZES AND CHANCES OF WINNING:

This chart shows the Win-10 prize levels, prize amounts, and chances of winning. For example, if you select 3 numbers and they match any 3 of the 20 winning numbers drawn, you win \$25.

If you select 6 or more numbers, you then have more than one way to win. For example, if you select 9 numbers you win:

- \$100,000 if your 9 numbers match any 9 of the 20 winning numbers.
- \$3,000 if only 8 of your 9 numbers match any 8 of the 20 winning numbers.
- \$250 if only 7 of your 9 numbers match any 7 of the 20 winning numbers.

As shown in the chart above, if you pick 3 numbers, and all 3 match any of the 20 winning numbers drawn, you win \$25.00. At the Pick 6 level and above, there are consolation prizes. For example, if you pick 6 numbers and only 5 of them match the winning numbers, you win \$50.00. There's even a prize...at the Pick 10 level only...where you get \$4 if none of the 10 numbers you pick are selected.

There are 8 different ways to play and 17 ways to win.

HOW TO FIND OUT IF YOU'RE A WINNER:

Each night of the week, the Lottery will conduct a Win-10 drawing. Twenty numbers will be randomly selected. Winning numbers will be available at your Lotto agent, or you can call the Lottery Hotline—976-2020 (area codes 212, 718, 516, 914). In the Rochester area, the number is 974-2020. Daily newspapers should carry the winning numbers the following morning.

HOW TO CASH IN:

You can collect a cash payment the day following the drawing at any Lotto agent for prizes up to and including \$600. For prizes over \$600, you can file a claim at any Lottery office or complete a claim form (available at any Lotto agent location) and mail it (we recommend registered mail for your protection) to:

A claim form must be filed to collect on any winning ticket not cashed within 45 days after the drawing date. Prizes must be claimed within one year after the drawing date.

You must be 18 years or older to play Win-10 and all New York State Lottery games.
