## Alcohol Detox Unit Admits 223 In '86

A total of 223 persons were admitted for treatment during 1986 at the Alcohol Detoxification Unit of Canton-Potsdam Hospital, according to year-end statistics recently compiled.

Of those admitted, 83 percent were men and 17 percent were women. There were significant numbers of patients in every age range, with an average age of 40 for both men and women. The youngest patient was 19, the oldest 76.

Approximately 52 percent of patients admitted were from St. Lawrence County with 19 percent from Clinton County and 16 percent from Franklin County. The number of admissions from outside St. Lawrence County increased 27 percent over 1985.

The largest number of initial contacts, 18 percent, came through family or friends. Other frequent methods of referral were self-referral (14 percent), county alcoholism councils (16 percent), educational facilities (15 percent), Alcoholics Anonymous members (12 percent) and physicians (11 percent).

Almost any agency or individual may deal with an alcoholic at a time of crisis, and can help by being aware of community services that can link an individual to the most appropriate treatment resource. If an individual, family member or friend needs help, the person should call the Alcohol Detoxification Unit directly at 265-3000 or 1-800-545-3300. The Alcohol Detoxification Program provides a medically controlled safe withdrawal from physical dependence on alcohol. Admission to the program is voluntary and may be arranged by directly scheduling an appointment or referral from rehabilitation programs, physicians, outpatient counseling services, employee assistance programs, and self help programs. After completing detoxification, patients are usually placed in appropriate rehabilitation or outpatient programs.

The program serves residents of St. Lawrence, Franklin, Essex and Clinton counties.

## Dr. Dewar Named Chief Of Staff

Dr. Dewar is a Canton family practitioner and medical director of the Hospital's Alcohol Detoxification Unit. He succeeds Dr. Sebastian A. Mazzotta as chief of staff.

Since 1984, Dr. Dewar and his wife, Dr. Sandra McCloy, have practiced in association with Dr. Jon Kay. Previously, Dr. Dewar was an assistant professor in family medicine at the State University of New York at Buffalo School of Medicine, and also served as emergency department director for the Deaconess Division of Buffalo General Hospital during that time. He is a graduate of the University of Pennsylvania

Medical School.

In other medical staff appointments, Dr. Jon Kay was re-elected to a one year term as secretary/treasurer and three-term as chief of pediatrics; Dr. William Petersen was elected chief of surgery, succeeding Dr. Harry Howe; Dr. Jan Close was elected chief of medicine, succeeding Dr. Robert Rogers, II; and Dr. Michael Kiken was re-elected chief of obstetrics and gynecology.

All chief of department positions are three year terms. Other current department chiefs are Dr. Robert Rogers, I, pathology; Dr. Denis McLean, imaging services; Dr. James Wright, emergency services; Dr. Samuel Livingston, general practice; and Dr. Juliet Gill, anesthesiology.
