

Knights Shock Alfred For 3rd Win

The Clarkson men's basketball team split a pair of ICAC contests bowing to Ithaca College 75-63 on Friday and upsetting ICAC leading Alfred University 90-79 Saturday afternoon.

Senior forward Jon Iveson led the way in both games with 61 total points. Iveson followed a 32 point performance against Ithaca with 29 points against Alfred. The Knights are now 2-4 in the ICAC and 3-10 overall.

Clarkson and Ithaca played fairly even throughout the first half as neither team could build up a

sizable lead. Ithaca finally took a narrow 31-28 lead at the half on Vito Federicis three point hoop. The Knights kept it close and finally took their only lead of the second half when sophomore tri-captain Mark Vigren stole the ball and drove the length of the court and made the ensuing lay-up to make the score 37-35. The teams then traded baskets until with about 12 minutes to play, Ithaca ran off a 20-2 spurt to leave Clarkson behind 61-48.

Paul Bradshaw finished with 15 points and freshman center George

Revoek led the team with seven rebounds.

Alfred came into Saturday's contest with a 12-3 overall mark and 4-0 in the ICAC. The Knights made seven out of ten three point attempts in the first half with Bradshaw's three point basket giving Clarkson a 46-38 lead going into the half.

The Saxons, though, put on a charge and took a 60-56 lead midway through the second half. Clarkson made their comeback from the free throw line hitting 23 of 32 attempts in the second stanza. Iveson led the way with 29 points while Bradshaw added 15 points and senior forward Jeff Parsons added 14. Revoek had 11 points, 10 rebounds and three blocked shots.

Women Drop Two
The Clarkson University women's basketball team had a rough weekend on the road as it lost two games in a row for the first time this season.

On Friday, the Lady Knights traveled to Rochester where they fell to the number one ranked Division III team in the state, St. John Fisher, 59-41. In Geneva on Saturday, Clarkson suffered another defeat as highly rated William Smith came away with a 70-65 victory.

Receiving season-best performances from nearly all of the swimmers, the Potsdam College men's and women's swim teams swept the Plattsburgh State Cardinals Saturday afternoon.

The men, paced by Tom Caprio, Anthony Olivetto, and Pete Donahue, cruised past the Cards 111-80 for their second win of the season. Coach Ken McLaughlin led his women's squad to their first victory of the year, edging Plattsburgh 7-57.

In the medley relay, the 200 I.M., and the 100 butterfly, Olivetto took the 1000 free, the 500 free, and was a member of the winning medley relay team. Donahue, one of the SUNYAC's premier sprinters, won the 200 and 100 freestyles.

Diver Sean Gallagher placed first in both the optional and required diving events. Some other fine efforts were turned in by Bill Schaab (seconds, 50 free), Brian Burns (qualified for state championships in the 200 I.M.), and Rob Welcher (qualified for the state championships in the 100 back).

On the women's side, Jackie Miller, a St. Lawrence Central graduate, took first place in three events and Malone's Catherine Delisle had one first place to lead the Bears to the win.

Miller won the 200 free, the 100 back, and the 100 breast, while Delisle won the 500 free and just missed qualifying for the states in the 200 fly by .4 seconds. Kathy Gibson was first in the 200 I.M. and second in the 100 free. Kathy Little earned two second place finishes in the 500 free and 50 free. Leah Leabo took a second in the required diving and was runner-up in the 100 back.

McLaughlin is pleased with his teams' performances so far this winter. "They have all done as well or even better than I expected; even in events which they're not used to racing," said McLaughlin.

Women's Basketball
Powerful Albany State, 11-1 on the season, handed the Potsdam College women's basketball team a 68-49 defeat Saturday night in Potsdam.

The Bears, led by freshman center Karen Leach, gave the state-ranked Lady Danes a battle for 30 minutes, before the talented visitors pulled away for the easy win.

Leach, a force under the boards, scored 15 points and ripped down 17 rebounds to pace Potsdam. Star Lake's Kelly Patraw added 12 points and Lori Clarke pumped in 10 markers.

For Albany, Wisconsin native Chris LaBombard tallied a game-high 17 points from her point guard slot. Alisha Parrish came off the bench to score 16 points.

Potsdam trailed 30-21 at the half and had cut the Albany lead to seven in the second half.

The night before, Potsdam earned their third win of the year and first in nearly two months when they outlasted New Paltz 55-53. The

Bears had built up a 34-22 halftime lead and had to withstand a strong Hawk comeback bid.

Potsdam boasted balanced scoring, picking up at least nine points from all five starters. Norwood-Norfolk graduate Mary Michalak led all Bears with 12 points (she also had nine rebounds). Clarke added 10, while Leach (11 rebounds), Jody Heller, and Patraw (13 rebounds) all purred in nine points.

New Paltz was paced by Sue Cunningham's 24 point night and

Oswego came into the game with a paltry 1-8 record, but picked up a strong game from Gretchen Tucker, who scored 23 points and dished out six assists.

Potsdam was led by Heller's 18 points and Leach's 15 rebounds. Clarke (15) and Val Cavanaugh (10) also hit double figures for Coach Addy Malatesta's club.

Troubles continued for the slumping Potsdam College hockey team last week as they dropped two SUNYAC contests on the road.

On Saturday afternoon, lowly Brockport handed the Bears a disappointing 7-5 defeat. Potsdam fell behind 6-0 in the contest and never could catch the Golden Eagles.

Scoring goals for the Bears, now 7-14, were Mike Steckler, Ogdensburg's Thad Jeneault, Sean Provost, Steve Stone (1-1), and Lee Ianotti. Massena's Buffy Richards had an assist along with Dan Smith and Mike Henry.

Goaltender Keith Kiendle stopped between the pipes and started eight shots in the first period before being pulled in favor of Paul Carney (19 saves). Brockport's Scott Welch stopped 48 shots for the winners.

Nationally-ranked Geneseo defeated Potsdam 3-2 Friday night thanks to an outstanding 53-save performance by goalie Phil Wheaton.

Defenseman Howie Vandermast scored both of the Bears tallies.

Wrestler Lose Two
Coach Neil Johnson knew his wrestlers were in for a tough time Saturday with two national powers coming to Maxcy Hall.

He was right. The University of Buffalo is quickly establishing themselves as a contender for the SUNYAC and national title. They showed the Bears why, handing the hosts a 45-3 loss. 126-pounder Mark Cipollone registered the lone Potsdam win, a 10-9 decision over Victor Spinelli.

After Albany State finished beating St. Lawrence, the Great Danes entered Maxcy Hall and left with a 35-16 win over Potsdam.

Wins for the Bears came from Marty Coppola (pin at 142), and Dave Vinson (technical fall at 5:08). Roy Hickok and Jim Goetz picked up points by drawing with their foes at 134 and 158, respectively.

Clarkson left its scoring touch at home against St. John Fisher as the Knights shot only 25 percent from the floor (15-60) and fell behind early, trailing 31-18 at the half.

Sophomore Mary Silva was the only Knight in double figures, scoring 12 points.

In a closer contest against William Smith, Clarkson had the chances to win it, but 30 turnovers kept the Knights from the victory column. Freshman Amy Huestis was the Green and Gold's top scorer with 17 points. She also had a team high 11 rebounds.

Sophomore Laurie Beauchamp of Ogdensburg contributed 14 points and a team high nine assists, with freshman Melissa Smith also having a good game scoring 10 points and grabbing 10 rebounds.

Swimmers Win
Clarkson's swim teams returned to action on Saturday, after a month and a half layoff, with the men's squad posting its fifth victory of the season, defeating McGill 114-90 at Fuller Pool. The women's swim team dropped a 132-43 decision to McGill.

Senior Jerry Miller led the Golden Knights with first place finishes in the 50 and 100 freestyle races with winning times of 24.6 and 55.33 respectively. He also anchored Clarkson's winning 400 freestyle relay team. Chris Slocum, Steve Behrens, and Ed Hampson were also part of the team which posted a winning time of 1:09.02 and finished second in the 200 individual medley.

Don Poitras took first in the diving competition.

Junior Jon Mastroianni was the Lady Knights only first place finisher in the swimming events, winning the 50 freestyle with a time of 30.6. Sophomore Barb Funston placed second in the 100 freestyle. Senior Jen Forsythe won the diving competition.
